









ACE-UIA International Conference Design Competitions UNESCO Headquarters, Paris, Friday 25 October 2019, 9:00 – 18:00

The Architects' Council of Europe and the International Union of Architects are organising an **International Conference on Design Competitions** that will bring together architects, urban planners, the public sector and international organisations.

The purpose? To reflect on the importance of quality in the built environment and how architecture competitions can act as a tool for the promotion of higher-calibre outcomes.

The conference will combine thematic panel discussions and high-profile keynote speakers who will share their experienced perspectives:

While there is a broad consensus on the fact that a high-quality built environment impacts positively on people's everyday lives, it can prove difficult for public authorities, project developers and built environment professionals to assess and guarantee the quality of the buildings and urban spaces they commission and design.









Through architectural competitions, society benefits from solutions imbued with cultural values that contribute to a sustainable future. In this context, the ACE and the UIA invited high-level speakers to an international conference to reflect on the importance of *quality* in the built environment and the opportunities stemming from competitions.
