The European Year of Cultural Heritage 2018

1.Events

Raise awareness, participate, celebrate, discuss

- Over **100 events** at European level
- Over **7840** events at national level

2. Projects and 10 European initiatives

Build a legacy, foster transnational cooperation

- Funding for cultural heritage across different EU programmes (from Creative Europe, E+, H2020 to EU structural and cohesion funds)
- 40 Interreg/urban projects are using the label of the year
- Policy: quality standards, urban OUR HERITAGE: WHERE THE PAST MEETS THE FUTURE regeneration, regional development, sustainable cultural tourism....























Among the 10 European initiatives of the EYCH are:

- Heritage in transition: reimagining industrial, religious, military sites and landscapes
- Cherishing heritage: developing quality standards for interventions on cultural heritage
- Heritage-related skills: better education and training for traditional and new professions









Heritage in transition: re-imaginin industrial, religious, military sites and landscapes

- Aims at promoting good practice and smart ways
 - to transform Europe's industrial, religious and military heritage for new use(r)s;
 - to turn it into a driver of sustainable development for European cities and regions.
- Target groups: Local/regional authorities and communities, heritage professionals and architects.
- 3 components





Component I: Exchange of good practice

- Old sites and new functions: Sharing our built heritage with the next generation, EHHF, Luxemburg – 16/18 May
- European Cultural Heritage Summit: Workshop on Adaptive Reuse, Berlin - 20 June 2018
- FRH conference on religious heritage, Paris 11/13
 October 2018
- Architects' Council of Europe conference on Adaptive Reuse, Leeuwarden – 24 November 2018





Component II: Engagement

- Torch of Heritage and Culture: from Leeuwarden (8 January 2018) to Paris (12 October 2018)
- Work it out! A pan-European dance performance in ERIH sites - 1 May 2018
- Open doors days for private chapels throughout Europe - 24-27 May 2018
- E-Faith activities dedicated to adaptive re-use of industrial heritage - October 2018





Component III: Sustainable development

- Horizon 2020 projects ROCK and CLIC will develop innovative "circular" financing, business and governance models for systemic adaptive reuse of cultural heritage
- Erasmus+ projects EuropeTour (cultural tourism in rural areas) and REVAB (open training system on the restoration and reuse of farm buildings)
- URBACT projects on the reuse of vacant spaces



Davos Declaration

- Central role of culture in the built environment
- Baukultur, as a common good, is a shared responsibility of governments, organisations and the private sector.
- Multilevel and interdisciplinary cooperation
- Participation, education and awareness-raising



High-quality Baukultur: Action 1 Quality

- Promote the principles of High-Quality Baukultur in the future Regulations of the EU programmes, in particular the Structural Funds.
- European Directors of Architecture
- § 19 of the Davos Declaration (implement policies that embrace the concept of High-Quality Baukultur).

High-quality Baukultur: Action 2 Mobility

- Promote the mobility of architects within the forthcoming mobility scheme for artists and culture professionals (already tested in 2018).
- § 20 of the Davos Declaration (actions and measures which contribute to the promotion and implementation of High-Quality Baukultur).



High-quality Baukultur: Action 3

Education/Skills

- Propose actions under Erasmus+ to support the integration of the principles of High-quality Baukultur into the curricula of universities/ architecture schools
- § 20 and § 17 of the Declaration on the importance of education.



High-quality Baukultur: Action 4 Participation

- Organise an OMC group on participatory governance of architecture in the next Work Plan for Culture (2019/2022).
- § 18 of the Davos Declaration (mainstreaming High-Quality Baukultur to all stakeholders including the general public).



High-quality Baukultur: Action 5 Heritage

- Follow up the European Year of Cultural Heritage with a European Action Plan for Cultural Heritage, based on the principles of High-Quality Baukultur.
- EU Urban Agenda: Partnership on Heritage
- § 9 of the Davos Declaration (cultural heritage is a crucial component of High-Quality Baukultur).
