The KTP has drafted new legislation which regulates access to the profession in accordance with the relevant Directives. It is also proposing to strengthen self-regulating procedures for professional conduct and to reduce the period of liability for the structural integrity of buildings from fifteen years down to eight to ten years. The proposed law will be presented in Parliament before the end of the current legislature.

To lobby and explain that the European Institutions need to recognise that only 4% of the architects in Europe work in practices which comprise more than 5 staff. These small practices do not have the resources to offer their services outside their country. While larger practices benefit from practicing freely throughout Europe, the EC should study the impact of an increased domination of the market by these large practices over the smaller ones. The playing field is not level.
