- J. S. Bach was born







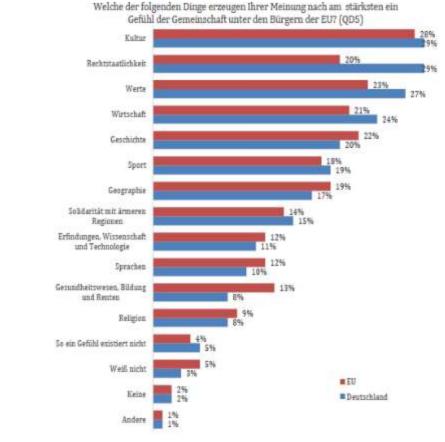


Background

Cultural heritage is

- · a unique resource
- potential of becoming a key lever for more cohesive and sustainable regions in the EU
- strengthens identity in a region as well as in Europe as a whole







European Year of Cultural Heritage in 2018 (EYCH2018)

- Unique opportunity to involve citiziens of every generation
- Development of strategies at local and regional level and their contribution to other sectoral policies, with a focus on territorial development
- Events and projects emphasising Europe's cultural heritage and values
- Opportunity to spot on less known or unknown heritage sites, especially in remote areas

Adaptive re-use of built heritage

- > Fostering the knowledge and awareness for common cultural heritage both in society and politics
- > not just the lack of financial resources for, but also the inadequate visibility of and lack of political awareness about, cultural assets are an obstacle to cultural heritage being developed as a region's strategic resource
- Development of strategies at local and regional level
- > Fostering knowledge exchange between cities and regions capacity building!
- > priority given to the restoration and preservation of monuments, the management and outreach work of cultural institutions is also crucial and is what decides whether cultural monuments are able to fully develop their cultural tourism, economic and social impact
- > **support** for cultural heritage resources for regional development has to be made an important element of **cohesion policy after 2020** and other programmes within MFR



- transparency of decisions, Clear communication on facts, interests of the different stakeholders
- reliability on support for the investor (public or private)
- shared responsibility for all stakeholders in society local and regional authorities and the Member States – but also requires specific private-sector funding and voluntary/civil society activity
- participatory approaches in local and regional authorities to establish a broad social base for cultural development concepts and of gaining more backing for and identification with cultural investment. This will lead to a sustainable boost to social interaction and to society's responsibility for local cultural heritage
- And if there is not yet the "perfect" re-use concept: Don't be anxoius to allow intermediate use!
- Talking about standards of preservation, accessibility, workingspace...

European Cultural Route of Reformation - INTERREG V B (Central Europe)

project objective: promotion of cultural tourism and enforcement of a common cultural identity by holding on to the common cultural heritage of Reformation

project results: i.a. pilot investments (multimedia-informationpoints, information panels), establishing of a an umbrella brand (mobil-app/webpage), application for the certification/acceptance of the route by the Council of Europe

EU-Funding: 1,9 Mio. € (2016 – 2019)

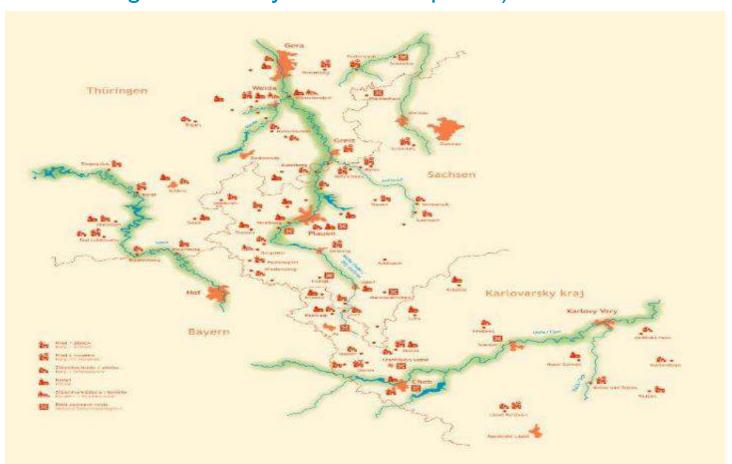

project partners in Thuringia: Thuringian Landcompany (Lead Partner), Church and Tourism e.V.

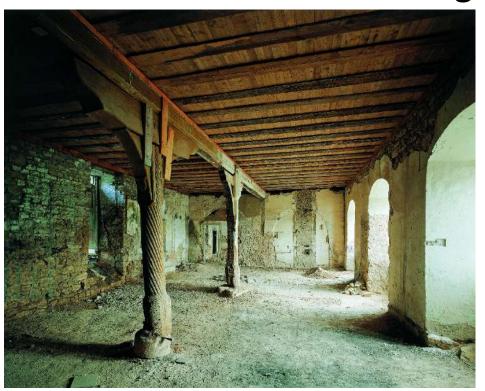

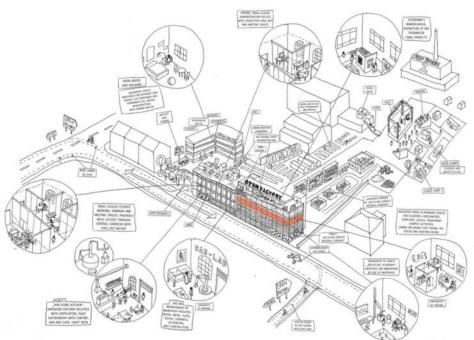
