# STATE PRIZE FOR ARCHITECTURE in Lower Saxony (Germany)

- since 1996 every two years
- since 2002 in cooperation with the Chamber of Architects of Lower Saxony (AKNDS)
- the state's highest architectural prize and a central component of the State Initiative Baukultur





## STATE PRIZE FOR ARCHITECTURE in Lower Saxony — Evaluation Criteria 2022

→ applied depending on the characteristics present in the individual case

#### **Urban design qualities**

- Quality of urban space and urban design
- Implementation of climate protection-oriented urban planning aspects
- Consideration of integrative tasks of social coexistence
- Special conceptual, identity-creating considerations
- Radiating power on other areas of the surroundings / urban society

#### **Design qualities**

- Quality of architectural design: construction, proportion, spatial image
- Functionality and usability
- Need-based flexibility and variability
- Innovative content
- Design value / detail development

#### **Qualities of use**

- Relation to the location / identification
- Conservation of resources and economic use of materials (sustainability)
- Energy efficiency
- Expandability and developability / flexibility
- Acceptance by users / user value
- Exemplary whole life performance

## WINNER: Reorganisation an renovation of the KGS Leeste, Weyhe

This is a large school from the 1970s, typical of Germany, which has been excellently and sustainably converted.

A short quote from the jury's assessment: The KGS Leeste is "... – in several respects – a showcase project and an argument for conversion: the large-scale but poorly usable spatial structure from the 1970s was reinterpreted through targeted interventions in such a way that the potentially existing generosity can be experienced and used. Such a 'wasteful' use of space would no longer be conceivable as a new building – but it is conceivable as a conversion."

**NOMINATION 1:** Bückeberg Documentation and Learning Site, Emmerthal (Hameln)

The site designed by Hitler's Reich architect Albert Speer, which in terms of its importance can be placed on the same level as the Reich Party Day grounds in Nürnberg and the Tempelhofer Feld in Berlin, fell into oblivion after the Second World War...

A short quote from the jury's assessment: "Between 1933 and 1937, the Nazis held their harvest festival (Reichserntedankfeste) on this ridge near Hameln. Up to 1.2 million people cheered Adolf Hitler and National Socialism in perfectly staged performances. Now, more than 80 years later, the documentation and learning site puts history in the right light - factual, stylistically pure and restrained. ... Through the minimally invasive interventions and measures, the place is made tangible and experienceable in all its dimensions and staging, goose bumps included. ... A very successful example of doing ,little' and achieving ,much'."

### **NOMINATION 2:** Sustainable refurbishment at the Liebenau Education and Meeting Centre

A short quote from the jury assessment: "In a participatory process with many interested parties, the subsequent use of the existing building was conceived – today, a primary school, youth club, refugee initiative, sports club, adult education centre, music school and documentation centre can be found in the former school complex, which has grown steadily since the 1960s. ... The education and meeting centre is a very successful example of an integrative concept and implementation in an existing building. For changing user groups, potentials for ecological and social sustainability were created with a very low budget, but with well thought-out approaches, for which new teachers have already been enthused and won over."

**NOMINATION 3: District Centre Hannover-Stöcken**

A short quote from the jury assessment: "The Hanover district of Stöcken is a neighbourhood with challenges – creating a new centre for it is an urban planning, architectural and social task. For the new district centre, an inviting architectural form was developed and visibility both internally and externally was realised in an exemplary manner. … All building components are designed according to passive standards, and the ventilation system is based on heat recovery. The furnishings and surfaces are of high quality and sufficiently robust for long-term and flexible use. … In short: a very successful design of a new district centre that invites people to stay and participate in the neighbourhood."

- The scheme is synonymous with the "Declaration of Sustainability Architecture" of the initiative "Phase Sustainability" of the German Sustainable Building Council (DGNB) and the Federal Chamber of Architects 210810\_DGNB\_Phase\_Nachhaltigkeit\_Architektur.indd
- In a first step we insert a differentiation between new and existing buildings.
- → Result 2023: 40% of existing buildings
- → we intend to bring this up to 50% next year
